REGULAR SCHOOL HOURS

Grades UTK-5TH: 8:15a.m. - 2:43p.m. *All children should be picked up promptly.*

MORNING ARRIVAL

Students should not arrive at school until after 7:45 a.m. There is no supervision until this time. For safety reasons, please utilize all crosswalks with bringing your child to school.

Procedures for first day of school:

- Students should line up at their corresponding room number on the playground. Staff members will be available to assist in finding the line-up area.
- Please do not arrive prior to 7:45 a.m. as there is no supervision on the playground until that time.

IMPORTANT:

Parents entering the blue gate will be able to walk their children to their line on the yard this week only. Teachers will pick-up their students to walk them to class. Plan on wishing your child a wonderful new school year and wave to them as they walk to class. All parents must exit the campus by 8:25 a.m. If you would like to visit our Parent Center and have a cup a coffee there will be staff on the yard to guide you to the room.

Beginning Monday August 19th, parents will be asked to drop their children off at the gate.

***Please note this is for the safety of all students.*

Dismissal Procedures:

*Rooms 1, 2 and 3 students are dismissed at the UTK GATE on Mitchell Ave.

*Kindergarten students will be picked up at the KINDERGARTEN GATE (closest to Grand View Blvd.) on Mitchell Ave.

*Students in grades 1, 4 & 5 will be walked to the blue gate, closest to the auditorium, by their teachers.

*Students in grade 2 will be walked to the gate on Grand View Blvd., near the office, by their teachers.

*Students in grade 3 will be walked to the gate on Grand View Blvd., near the Reading Garden, by their teachers.

Before & After School Care

Ready, Set, Go! (Grades K-5) before-school program provides breakfast, learning games and activities on campus from 6:15-8:00 a.m., Monday-Friday. (Free)

L.A.'s Best (Grades UTK-5) provides academic assistance, enrichment, sports and recreational activities in a safe, supervised environment from dismissal on campus until 6pm, Monday-Friday. Requires parent or guardian sign-out. (Free)

Youth Services After School Playground (Grades 2-5) the program provides supervision of organized games and activities in a recreational setting for those students who drop into the program from dismissal on campus until 6:00 p.m. (Free)

Prime Time Sports Camp (Grades UTK – 5th) offers academic support, sports and recreation, and arts and enrichment on campus until 6pm, Monday-Friday. Enrichment classes include seasonal sports, recreational games, media arts, visual arts, photography, movie making, foreign languages, STEAM Team, and cultures and crafts. Boys & Girls Club (Grades K-5th) provides academic assistance, enrichment and recreational activities in a safe, supervised environment from dismissal until 6pm, Monday-Friday. This program is conducted off-site and transportation is provided. (Fee-based)

After School Playground begins the first week of school on August 12, 2024 from 2:43p.m. – 6:00p.m. Monday through Friday and 1:43p.m. - 6:00p.m. on Tuesdays.

Additional Information

EXTERNAL FOOD AND BEVERAGE DELIVERIES TO SCHOOLS FOR STUDENTS

The delivery of fast food/beverages for students is strictly prohibited as it is not consistent with school food service requirements, and it causes disruption to the school environment and the safety and well-being of students and employees.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNER ADVISORY COMMITTEE

This committee of staff and parents is responsible for the Master Plan for English Learners (bilingual program). It advises and assists the principal and staff in the implementation of the Master Plan; participates in the development of the bilingual budget; assists with efforts to make parents aware of the importance of the bilingual budget; assists with efforts to make parents aware of the importance of regular school attendance; and participates in training sessions and workshops that will provide the necessary skills and practice for the committee members to carry out their responsibilities.

SCHOOL SITE COUNCIL

This council has ongoing responsibility to review with the principal, teachers, and other school personnel and students the implementation of the School Improvement Program and to assess periodically the effectiveness of the program. The SSC shall receive the necessary training to enable it to carry out its responsibilities to develop, monitor, and modify the plan and the budget. Members of the committee include the principal, school personnel and parents. Half of the committee membership is to be parents and community.

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

It is required that new emergency information cards be completed each school year for every child. Please fill out this information completely. Children will only be released from school or cared for only by those adults you designate. From time to time it is necessary to contact a designated person if the parent cannot be reached. Please make all persons aware you are putting their names and phone numbers on your child's card. Also, please inform the school when any information on the card changes during the school year. If your child is new to Grand View ES this year, and you have completed one of the emergency cards in the office, please note that all designated representatives must be at least 18 years old.

HEALTH INFORMATION

In keeping with the State of California immunization requirements, new students may not be admitted to school unless a written immunization record is presented at the time of enrollment and immunizations are current. All new students enrolling at any grade level (K-12) must present an up-to-date immunization card. The immunization status of all students will be reviewed in keeping with State Law. Those students who do not meet State immunization requirements must be excluded from school until these requirements are met. Communicable disease inspections will be conducted periodically. Students with a communicable disease will be excluded from school until they are free of the disease.

Students who need to take prescribed medications during school hours must have on file in the office, the "**Request for Medication to Be Taken During School Hours**" form. The form must be completed and signed by your private physician including written instructions on how to administer the medication. The parent/guardian must also sign the form. All medication containers must be clearly marked with the child's name and instructions on the container must match the physician's instructions on the medication form. Medication must be brought to the school by the parent/guardian or other responsible adults. **CHILDREN ARE NOT PERMITTED TO TRANSPORT MEDICATION.**

SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS

We can use your talents in our classrooms, parent center, library, garden areas, assisting fund raising, school beautification efforts, and on our Parent Councils. Regular volunteers must have a "School Volunteer" application on file with L.A.U.S.D., including results of a negative Mantoux TB test/ chest x-rays taken within the last 6 months, Megan's Law Review and depending on the number of hours, finger printed. The application must be completed online at <https://volunteerapp.lausd.net/>.

SCHOOL SAFETY AND SECURITY

The main office is the only entrance to the school during class hours. Please cooperate with us by using this entrance. When bringing your children to school, please try to utilize the morning valet. For your child's safety, please utilize crosswalks, do not jay walk. When you visit the school, check-in at the office for a **VISITOR'S PASS or YOUR VOLUNTEER BADGE**. It is very important we know who is on campus at all times. So remember if you are coming to visit or volunteer you are to sign-in in the main office. When picking up your child after school, we are also asking that you wait outside the gate for your child. Be sure that your child knows what they are to go after school, i.e.; stay on playground, being picked up, childcare, etc.

When dropping off or picking up your child in front of the school be aware that double parking is illegal and dangerous. Read all parking signs carefully. Please observe street cleaning date/time. NO animals are allowed on campus.

ATTENDANCE

It is imperative that students attend school every day on time! If your child needs to be absent or miss part of the school day, please inform the teacher with a written note as to why and for how long. Try to schedule appointments after school, on weekend days or during vacation. On school days you should return students to school after appointments or bring them to school prior to appointments. Every day a student is absent we lose revenue for the school.
